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Academic Position Paper

The purpose of a position paper is to generate support on an issue. It describes the author's position on an issue and the rationale for that position and, in the same way that a research paper incorporates supportive evidence, is based on facts that provide a solid foundation for the author's argument. It is a critical examination of a position using facts and inductive reasoning, which addresses both strengths and weaknesses of the author's opinion.
