

## Assessment Of Serum Zinc Levels Of Patients With

The median serum Zn levels for both groups were within normal range: 100  $\mu$  g/dL (10  $\mu$  g/dL–297  $\mu$  g/dL) for patients and 92  $\mu$  g/dL (13  $\mu$  g/dL–212  $\mu$  g/dL) for siblings. There was no significant difference between the two groups.

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### **Assessment of serum zinc levels of patients with ...**

Results : Erythrocyte zinc levels were significantly lower in AD patients than in the control group ( $p < 0.001$ ), whereas serum zinc levels did not differ between the groups ( $p = 0.148$ ).

The serum zinc test measures the level of zinc in the blood serum. While many other nutrient deficiencies are marked by a clear clinical syndrome, in the case of zinc, there is no such indicator. The signs are related to general growth impairment and immune impairment that does not point specifically to the deficiency of the element.

### **Serum Zinc Test : Deficiency, procedure, & normal range ...**

Serum zinc and other electrolytes (Ca, Mg, Na, K, P, Cl) levels and diagnosis of patients were recorded to patient files and statistical analyses were performed. Results: Serum mean levels of Zn and Ca in the case group were lower than those of control group ( $p=0.011$  and  $0.013$  respectively).

### **Assessment of Serum Zinc Status of Children**

Interpretation Provides information to assist in interpretation of the test results. Normal serum zinc is 0.66 to 1.10 mcg/mL. Burn patients with acrodermatitis may have zinc as low as 0.4 mcg/mL; these patients respond quickly to zinc supplementation. Elevated serum zinc is of minimal clinical interest.

### **ZNS - Clinical: Zinc, Serum**

Levels may be low in fever, sepsis, estrogen therapy, stress, or myocardial infarction, reflecting mobilization from serum to the liver by interleukin. Levels are usually low in uremia with normal tissue levels. Levels may be high in familial hyperzincemia without toxicity or high zinc stores.

All cells require the mineral and no cell stores it. The concentration of zinc in the adult human is approximately  $0.5 \mu\text{mol g}^{-1}$ , giving a total body content of approximately 2 g. More than half is found in skeletal muscle and approximately 30% in bone.

Plasma or serum zinc levels are the most commonly used indices for evaluating zinc deficiency, but these levels do not necessarily reflect cellular zinc status due to tight homeostatic control mechanisms [ 8 ]. Clinical effects of zinc deficiency can be present in the absence of abnormal laboratory indices [ 8 ].

Serum was stored at  $-20^{\circ}\text{C}$  until later analysis in a laboratory in Khartoum for measurement of serum zinc and copper concentrations. Zinc and copper concentrations were measured by an atomic absorption spectrophotometer (SOLAAR, Atomic Absorption Spectrophotometer, Thermo Electron, Cambridge, UK).

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The most often used approach to assessment of zinc status, particularly in large population studies, is the measurement of serum zinc levels. Although relatively convenient, especially for epidemiological investigations, plasma zinc content is generally considered a poor measure of marginal zinc deficiency (King 1990).

Results: The level of serum zinc was significantly ( $P < 0.0001$ ) lower among cases ( $73.48 \pm 24.21$ ) compared with controls ( $119.48 \pm 52.78$ ).

### **Assessment of some micronutrients serum levels in children ...**

Mean serum level of magnesium was  $1.87 \pm 0.37$ , copper  $110.7 \pm 19.5$ , and zinc  $85.4 \pm 13.5$  in patients (control group), and  $2.22 \pm 0.24$ ,  $133.7 \pm 13.4$ , and  $110 \pm 8.3$  respectively in case group.
