Domain 1: Planning and Preparation. Domain 1 is often viewed as the groundwork of preparing and organizing for classroom instruction. This means taking the Common Core State Curriculum and interpreting the objectives so that all students can be successful in mastering them.

Domain 1 - Danielson’s Framework for Teaching
The Framework for Teaching Danielson initially organized the instructional practice into four domains: Planning and Preparation, The Classroom Environment, Instruction, and Professional Responsibilities.

Danielson divides the complex activity of teaching into twenty-two components clustered into four domains of teaching responsibility: (1) planning and preparation, (2)the classroom environment, (3)instruction,and (4) professional responsibilities. These domains and their components are outlinedin a following table.

The model focuses the complex activity of teaching by defining four domains of teaching responsibility: Domains 1 and 4 cover aspects of the teaching profession that occur outside the classroom, while Domains 2 and 3 address aspects that are directly observable in classroom teaching. (Danielson, 2011)

Teacher Effectiveness
One is for quickly identifying the components by Domains 1 & 4 and the other for Domains 2 & 3. Danielson’s key elements for the components are included. This is provides a more summative and accurate description of the components than others using performance indicators.
